

SBSOS FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It was quite a year for SBSOS!

We exceeded \$1 million raised since our inception 12 years ago, and SBSOS students have now received over \$2 million in private school and college grants and financial aid.

We continued our 100% high school graduation record with our one senior Merith Velazquez receiving an almost full scholarship to Lehigh University in Pennsylvania.

We received confirmation of 3 more students being awarded full scholarships to local private schools...Jimena Lopez to Garden Street Academy, Diego Velazquez to Laguna Blanca, and Jade Silva to Crane Country Day School.

Sebastian Paredes continued his squash successes from last year, defending his SoCal High School Championships individual title as well as leading a combination SBSOS/Santa Barbara Athletic Club team to the Team title, and he also won the BU19 Urban National Championships just a few days after turning 17!

Summer programming was amazing...apart from the 3 days a week of squash and educational projects we also had so many fun and interesting field trips, including Team A's highlight of a 4 day camping trip at Refugio State Beach.

I feel like Rebecca, Hannah, Miguel, and I really came together and grew as a staff, and we were lucky enough to have Amanda DeLaura, an intern from Westmont College for 3 months, bring fresh energy and ideas. Of course Dennis Marable, David Farber, Brian Shafritz, and Koji Tanaka continued their amazing devotion as volunteers too!

28 of our 30 students' parents came to a parent meeting which was a record attendance, and it's been wonderful to see more parental involvement and their trust and belief in our program be so strong.

I was a founding board member of SBSOS 12 years ago and have been Executive Director for 4 ½ years now. I am so proud of how far we have come and what we do. It's heart-warming to see so many smiles whenever the kids are together, to see how we truly are a family, and to undoubtedly be meeting our mission of "changing lives through squash and education".




Fitness and Health




