8 students participated in **one-on-one** tutoring sessions throughout the school year. As a result, 42% of our students were in AP or Core Knowledge Classes.



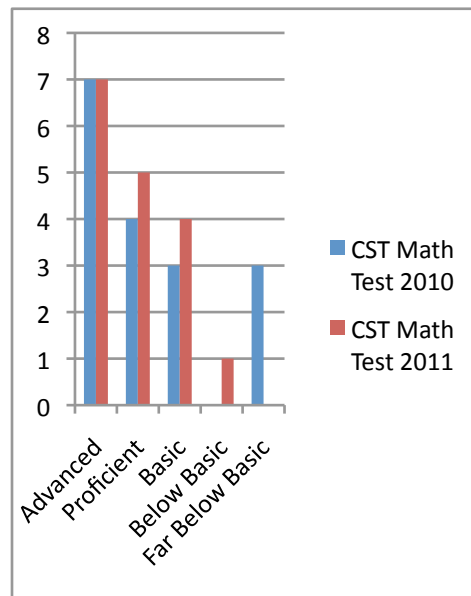
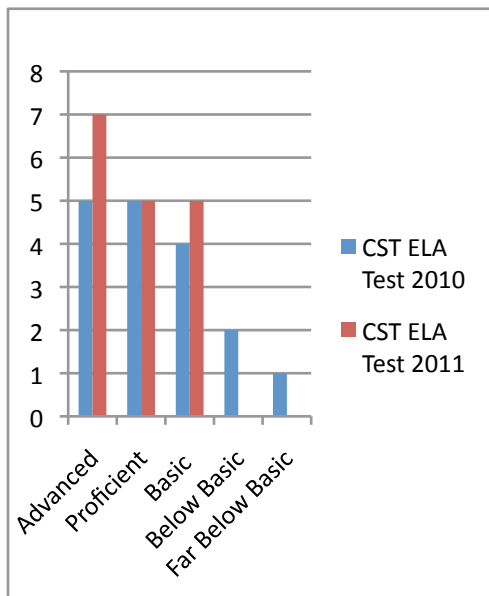

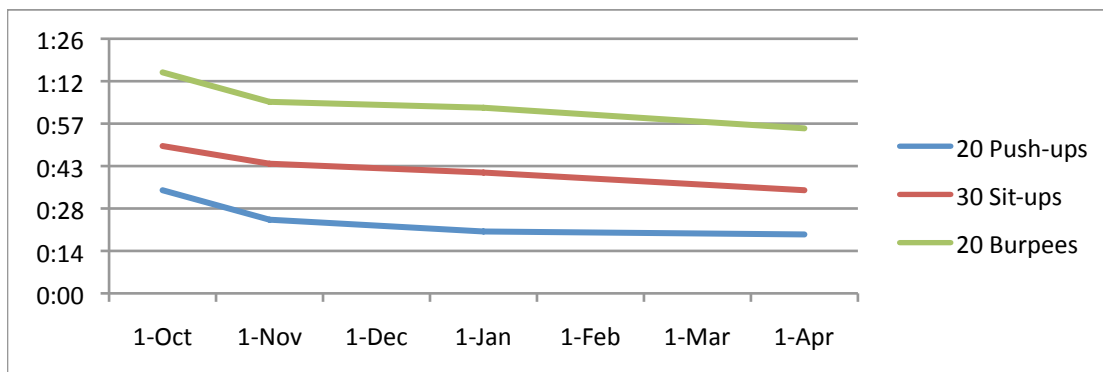

Utilization is determined by the program “daily attendance” divided by our program “daily student capacity”. This allows staff to monitor the program’s effectiveness in regard of student retention and as well as how we maximize our resources. Our average utilization was 82% for the year 2010-2011.

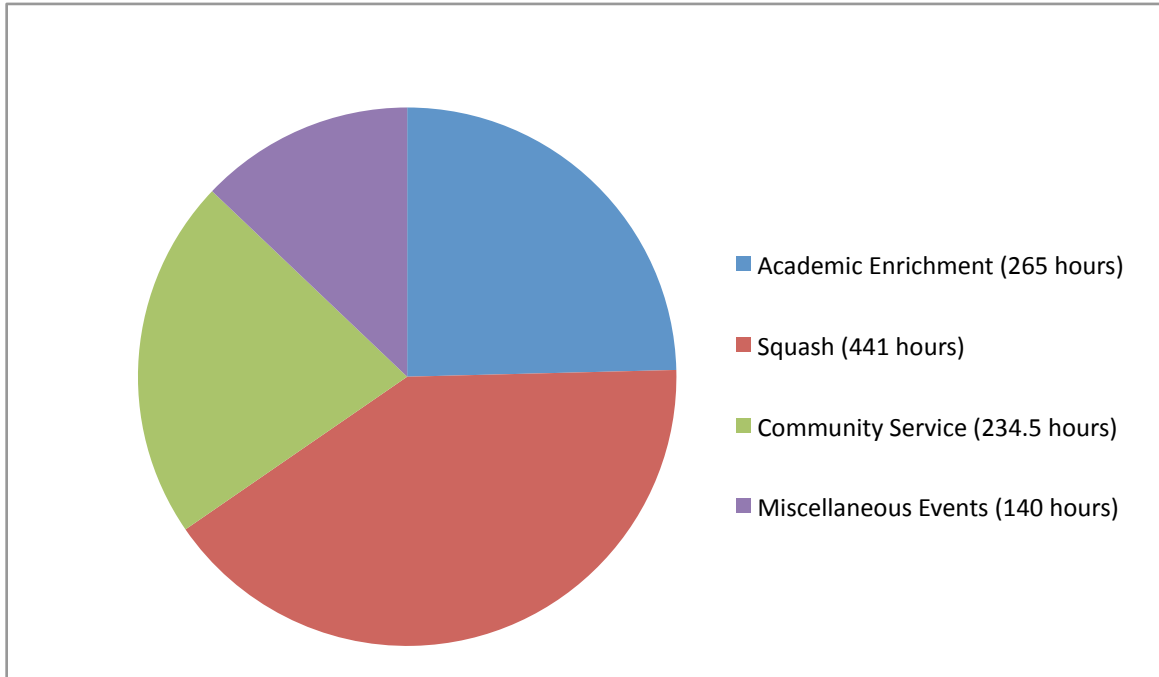
Community Service
